NATURE OF PROCEEDINGS: TERMS OF INFORMAL SUPERVISION BY THE  
COURT DURING PERIOD OF DEFERRED ENTRY

Counsel and defendant have stipulated to the terms of informal supervision during the term of deferred entry of pleas. Pursuant to such stipulation, the Court orders as follows:

Defendant forfeits all animals previously seized, except two (2) Andalusian mares. Defendant shall not have any other animals, without permission of the Court. Defendant may have the number of birds allowed by the Yolo County ordinance.

The two mares shall be returned to defendant on Saturday, December 17, 2005 as close to 10:00 a.m. as possible. The coordination of the return shall be done by Ms. Fletcher of the Yolo County Animal Services Division of the Yolo County Sheriff's Office and UCD.

Defendant shall be subject to search by the animal services division or any official of the Yolo County Sheriff's Office. Defendant shall provide a key to the property to Ms. Fletcher, or her representative, when the mares are returned on December 17, 2005.

Defendant agrees to keep the animals in good health. The animals shall have checkups every three months, with reports to be provided to the Court. Defendant has been provided pamphlets from UCD on the minimal care standards for these animals. Defendant must keep the animals' health at the standards set forth.

It is agreed and ordered that defendant shall pay \$20,000.00 in restitution for the care of all animals that are the subject of these cases. The restitution shall be in the form of a cashier's check, payable to the Yolo County Animal Services Division of the Yolo County Sheriff's Office. The check shall be delivered to Ms. Dunnells of the Yolo County District Attorney's office on or about January 25, 2006.

The term of informal supervision by the Court shall run from June 27, 2005 to June 27, 2008. The pleas shall remain in a deferred status during this time.

The Court orders this matter placed on calendar in Department One on Wednesday, January 25, 2006 at 8:30 a.m. for review. Defendant is ordered to appear that date and time.
